

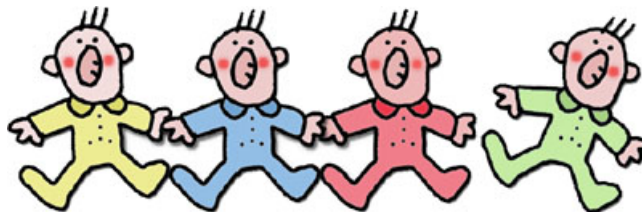
The modern child and the flexible labour market

The seminar, entitled *The modern child and the flexible labour market*, is the second international meeting related to our research project.
